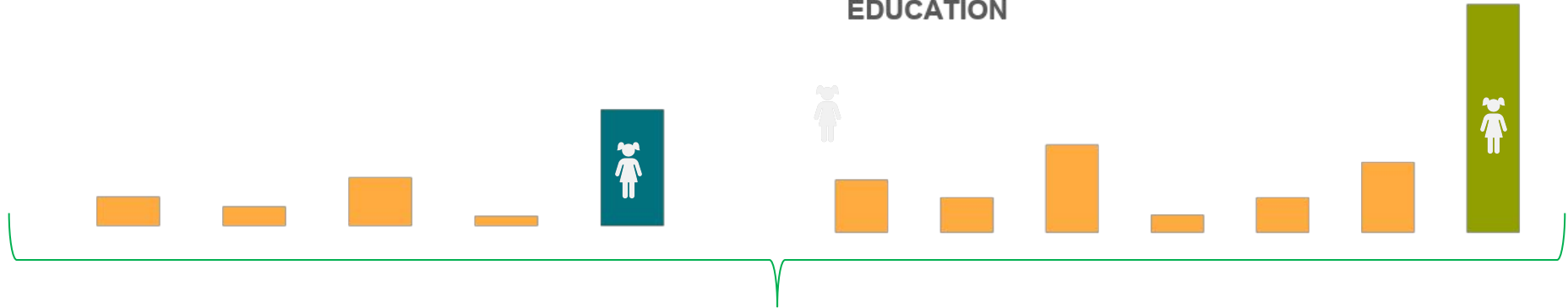

Support the expansion of childcare facilities to increase women's participation in production and community activities

Maintenance of gender-disaggregated educational statistics

The **existence** of a gender component in State standards and special programmes and courses in vocational education

Ensuring **equal access** to education for children, adolescents and adults of both sexes

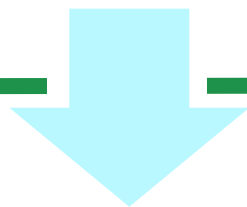


Promotion of the concept of «Kyrgyz Zharany» through the education system and the formation of the civil identity of each person



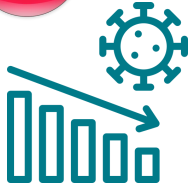


New requirements have been adopted for the development and evaluation of educational and methodological systems, including **gender and anti-discrimination**

Through COVID-19



70% of teachers in schools have not been trained



Students often used to miss online classes.

Reasons: technical problems with the Internet or its complete absence as well as household chores which fall on the children's shoulders during the quarantine

Weak internet or its total absence, as well as the lack of mobile devices to access the internet
